Presentation Day - Wednesday 9th,10am at Bungwahl School

We are pleased to advise that we are now able to proceed with our presentation day assembly and would like to invite you to join us for this special event.

The assembly will be held in the school grounds outside the shed and under the tallow wood tree. We must adhere to COVID-19 safe restrictions to hold this event and we ask that you respect the following guidelines provided by the Department of Education.

Schools must have in place and comply with the COVID-19 Safety Plan.

- Ensure that all attendees, including students, staff and visitors, including parents and carers, are well and free of any flu-like symptoms.
- Schools must comply with the 4 square metre rule for all people participating. Schools will need to invite guests based on the total number of people (this includes staff, students, parents and carers and visitors) who are able to be accommodated under the 4 square metre rule.
- For seating arrangements: ensure there is enough space for distancing of 1.5 metres between non-household members
- Ensure all visitors sign the external visitors form
- Ensure people remain seated as much as possible to minimise mingling outside of household or close friend groups.
- Ensure there is no self-serve or buffet-style food service.
- Special guests must be kept to a minimum and be included in the maximum number of participants for the 4 square metre rule.
- Adopt and promote good hygiene practices. Make sure that bathrooms are well stocked with hand soap and paper towels or hand dryers. Have hand sanitiser at key points around the venue such as entry and exit points.

• External visitors should not be allowed access to areas outside of the designated event venue and should leave promptly at the conclusion of the event.

To comply with these regulations we will not be serving morning tea after the presentation or showing the Captains Slide show in a room following the presentations. Special guests have not been invited to hand out awards and the format of the presentation day will be different.

We ask that only 2 members from each family attend the assembly unless your student is in Year 6. If your student is in Year 6 and you would like to invite additional family members please phone the school and we will do our best to accommodate your requests within the guidelines.

The play equipment will not be available for younger siblings during or after the event.

We are delighted to be able to recognise and honour the success of our wonderful students and we look forward to celebrating their achievements with you.
